DIRECTORY INFORMATION

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA"), a Federal law, requires that UPCS, with certain exceptions, obtain a parent/guardian written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from his or her child's education records. However, UPCS may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless a parent/guardian has advised UPCS to the contrary in accordance with this policy.

"Directory information" is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released. Directory information can be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's/guardian's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks. UPCS has designated the following information as directory information:

- Student's name
- Address
- Telephone listing
- Electronic mail address
- Photograph
- Date and place of birth
- Dates of attendance
- Grade level

If you do not want UPCS to disclose directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify UPCS in writing at the time of enrollment or re-enrollment. Please notify the Executive Director or designee at:
