 ADMINISTRATION AND SAFETY INFORMATION FOR ALL AUTO-INJECTORS: Do not put your thumb, fingers or hand over the tip of the auto-injector or inject into any body part other than mid-outer thigh. In case of accidental injection, go immediately to the nearest emergency room. If administering to a young child, hold their leg firmly in place before and during injection to prevent injuries. Epinephrine can be injected through clothing if needed. Call 911 immediately after injection. OTHER DIRECTIONS/INFORMATION (may self-carry epinephrine, may self-administer epinephrine, etc.):
